Haven came to Mount Laurel Animal Hospital after she was tragically hit by a car. She was badly hurt and in shock when she presented to our emergency service.

She was found to be bleeding into her abdomen and had air leaking around her lungs. She also had evidence of head trauma a broken and dislocated hip. Haven was aggressively stabilized with multiple blood transfusions and the air was removed from around her lungs in a procedure called a thoracocentesis which immediately helped her breath better.

Luckily, Haven did not need emergency surgery for her chest or abdominal trauma and steadily improved over several days in our ICU. Once her lungs and abdomen were more fully healed, Haven returned for surgery on her hip. She had a femoral head and neck ostectomy (FHO) performed by our orthopedic surgery department. With the help of The EMPATH PROJECT, her amazing dad in her corner and our team of veterinarians, nurses, and staff, Haven has fully recovered and we expect her to live a long, happy, and healthy life!
