

What To Expect

To ensure a successful experience we have included some information about your pet's consult and what to expect. The initial exam includes 3 important initial diagnostics of the eyes. These diagnostics include a fluorescein stain test to evaluate the surface of the eye for scratches, a Schirmer tear test to measure tear production, and Tono Vet to measure the pressure in the eyes. The appointment will last approximately 30 minutes. You are welcome to attend the appointment in person, inside the hospital, or if you prefer, I can speak to you curbside or over the phone. *Please do your best to arrive on time. If you arrive more than 10 minutes late, then we may need to reschedule.

Preparing For Your Visit

Prior to your pet's appointment, please take a few moments to complete the Ophthalmology questionnaire at https://mlahvet.com/ophthalmology/.

Our team makes a diligent effort to obtain all pertinent medical records prior to your pet's appointment, however, some referral veterinarians require client permission to send records to other veterinarians.
